

It seemed a waste of a trip just to do that, so have entered basic Imac with the Edge. Probably a bit underpowered and a bit small but it will be an interesting experience. What I learned on our fun aerobatics' day is that there are a lot of things you do in general flying, that, without the discipline of a routine you get away with and you never really get the model itself right. Lots of changes to the Edge have it flying a lot better, so we'll see.

The sim is getting a thrashing at the moment, as weather isn't conducive to flying. I also took the opportunity over the last 6 weeks to have a really good check over the Smith.

All models need maintenance, but larger models only keep flying if you look after them. I found problems in the tank and problems in the rigging.

Having addressed these, I can now have confidence it will do another summer.

After the success of the Glider Fun Fly held last summer, the Levin Club is keen to run two Levin Glider Fun Flys this summer, the first being on Saturday 9 December, the second in 2024 with the date to be advised.

Format: Fun fly for soarers. No entry/landing fee. It's all about having fun with like-minded glider guiders! Dig out those gliders or electric soarers that may have been tucked away for months or years! Bring along your electric, winch, bungee or hand launched glider and come soaring. All welcome. The day is about having fun flying soarers together no matter what your ability or sophistication of model. We anticipate Radians/Gentle Ladies right through to full house moulded soarers. Help available on the day, don't hesitate to ask the organisers.

Christmas Lunch: The Levin Club is putting on a Christmas Lunch at the Glider Fun Fly for both members, spouses and visiting pilots at no charge. Bring your own plate, cutlery, glass and chair. Please advise your intention to attend to levinmodelclub@gmail.com so the club has an indication of numbers for catering and to ensure there is enough to go around. Make a day of it! N.B. The lunch will go ahead whatever the weather.

Location: Levin flying strip, Tararua Road. Coming from the south, having turned right over the railway line opposite the Allied fuel pump and then immediate right at the T intersection, continue along Tararua Road past JB's on the right and Trayla on the left. The field turnoff is on the right about 50 metres past the 80km speed sign – you can see the clubhouse and the hay barn from the road.

Cancellation notification: Given the busy time of year and the need to work around the farmer's silage cutting plans, the event will either be flown on the advertised date or cancelled. Ernie Thompson

It was with some sadness and surprise that we learned, last week, of the passing of Ernie Thompson.

Ernie had passed at the end of September. We found out when, within a few days of each other, John von Hartitzsch found his FB page and Deanne Searancke went to visit him. Ernie was a larger-than-life member of the club; well known for the beautiful spitfire he built which is on display at Southwards.


He also gave a riveting talk one club night, some years back, on his Harvard experiences. He was well known in plastic modelling circles and won many awards.

The following FB post from Dave Homewood, pretty much sums up Ernie.

I am sad to hear the news that Ernie Thompson passed away last night in his sleep. He had been ill for a while. Ernie was one of the original members if NZ Warbirds Association Inc and he owned two of the Harvard's that were purchased from the RNZAF when they were disposed of, one of them, ZK-ENE, he flew for some years. He formed the very first civilian Harvard pair display with Phil Hewett for Easter 1979.

Later that year Ernie and the late Trevor Thomas Bland and John Denton formed a three-ship Harvard Aerobatic Team and that would develop over a short amount of time into the Roaring 40s team we know now.

Ernie was also a very good model maker. He recently turned 80 years old. RIP Ernie, and thanks for all you did in the early days of warbird preservation.
