


Mataríkí public holíday means a great day at the stríp

June Club night

For our June club night, we had Peter Randerson talk to us about the wing's renewal programme. Pete's presentation was thought provoking, straight forward and I think gave us all a good understanding of the way forward. Much of what he presented is available on the MFNZ website and members should make themselves familiar. It is apparent that we have fared better than model fliers in many other countries.



As members should by now know, wings will need to be renewed every 5 years. Kick-off is 2025.

Here are some of the points made.





Part A - Online, Open Book Airspace & Rules test

Part B - Flight Test

Part A - Oral test local site rules

Large Model endorsement, you will sit your wings with such a model. It is apparent that some modelers may only be able to resit their wings elsewhere. e.g. If you have a jet qualification and your model can't be flown at our strip, then that may need to be done at Tokoroa. This may also apply to those flying large gliders. It's about safety.



When will I do my test?

 Current planning is to schedule renewals on fliers DOB eg: If DOB was 24 Apr 1965 then first renewal due date would be 24 April 2025...... Or

If DOB was 25 Dec 0000 then first renewal date would be 25 Dec 2030

- Clearly some flex will need to be provided in the first year
- 3. Online test results will be valid for 12months.

Note Part A. This open book test requires a pass of 80 %. The pass is valid for 12 months so gives you 12 months to sit Parts B and C.

So, what will I be tested on? You will be required to fly a model at the upper end of your wing's qualification. e.g. If you have a



I understand some online training will be given to examiners prior to this kicking off.

It won't be hard and it shouldn't be onerous.

One thing to note is that, although we have a large number of members in the club, many are non-active. We shouldn't have a problem getting through the numbers to be tested.

Please check out the appropriate info on the MFNZ website.

If you have questions you can't find answers to on the website, yell out and we'll endeavour to answer them for you.

Handy hints

Well, nobody has come up with more except Pierre and me. So, here's a couple and also some experiences with things.

From Pierre

I've a always had difficulty handling and trimming film and tape. For some reason it always seems to blunt the blades and drag resulting in wavy edges and wrinkles.

I thought I would try using the trimmer that comes with the large

pack of Glad Wrap. Worked a treat.

I was able to stick the tape to the rails of the trimmer, get a good straight cut and then easily peel off.

Mounting canopies can be a pain. I'm not talking about the serious scale type model here, but more the sports model that many of us fly. These canopies are usually glued on, although some are screwed. That's fine until you need to get it off for a repair or replace the pilot etc. Then it becomes a challenge. To avoid this, I don't glue my canopies on. Instead, I use a tube of ordinary Mitre10 translucent silicon as the adhesive. Maybe a screw as well depending. Pull your mount on with some masking tape until it goes off. You don't need much. Just a small bead. Then if you have to remove the canopy, its easy to cut thru the silicone.

I also use this silicone at times where I've got a wire run that gets in the way. A dab of silicone will hold the wire where you want it.

An experience not to be repeated.

If you do any fibre glassing using an Epoxy resin, you will know that mixing rates are critical. These epoxies are usually mixed with their hardener at around 4 to 1 or 5 to 1, depending on the brand. Also depending on the brand is whether or not this ratio is by weight or volume. One thing to be aware of is that 'more' hardener doesn't speed up the curing process. Recently I was mixing up a batch to patch the cowl on the Edge. I got the ratio just right on my scales. Unfortunately, as I wiped the drip on the side of my bottle of hardener on my vessel, I spilt in more hardener. I had no idea how much. So I added more resin and hoped for the best. I had mixed into a small plastic container. As I worked away I noticed the container had melted with the heat being put off by the resin mix. There was stuff all over the bench. The resin did sort of set on my work, as in it stopped being tacky, but it never properly hardened and ended up like a piece of hard chewing gum!

Covering old?

Covering. How old is your covering? Over recent years I have been given and have acquired full and part rolls of covering. Experience with 2 unopened rolls is interesting. Both were silver. One was Oracover and the other Toughlon. When I went to use them, they wouldn't stick, and I found the glue had gone into a powder form and was falling off the covering. Looked like dandruff! Both of these rolls had been stored in a loft space and I suspect suffered degradation from heat.
